Dear Readers,

Spring is on the way. Hallelujah! Remember to turn your clocks forward one hour at 2 a.m. on March 11th at the beginning of Daylight Saving Time. March 20th is the first day of spring! Our days are finally getting longer and warmer. All around you can find the spring bulbs beginning to peak out of the soil and the grass is greening up.

Exercise caution turing grazing animals out into lush green grass. Grass tetany is a common problem in early spring. That lush and tasty grass tends to be high in potassium and low in magnesium (Mg) and calcium (Ca).

Deficiencies can become evident within hours and the time lapse between noticable symptoms and death can be as few as 4 hours for mature lactating cows with young claves. Younger livestock are less prone to grass tetany and will take longer to show symptoms because they are able to metabolize Mg and Ca from their bones more readily than mature animals.

Signs of grass tetany begin as restlessness, nervousness, and flighty movements that progress to skin twitching, muscles spasms, convulsions, and finally respiratory failure.

To lower your risk of tetany, supplement cattle with a high Mg mineral beginning 2 weeks before turn out and make free-choice access available in the pasture. Limit access to tetany risk pasture while the animals adjust.

March also marks the beginning of my third year as your county ag agent. I have enjoyed it immensly and cherish the relationships that are being built between us. I look forward to many more.

In the pages that follow you will find information about a variety of programs and events coming up in Noble and surrounding counties. I hope you will find at least one intriging for your enterprises. Happy spring everyone!






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East Ohio Women in Agriculture Conference
